SENDING HOPE TO HAITI #HOPE2HAITI

Breedlove and Operation HOPE Partner to Offer Food Aid for Hurricane Victims

LUBBOCK, TX (October 20, 2016) - [Breedlove Foods, Inc.](#), a Lubbock-based humanitarian relief organization, and [Operation HOPE USA](#) announce today a collaboration to provide critical food aid for Hurricane Matthew victims in Haiti. The nonprofits are joining forces in an immediate effort to raise funds to send a 20-foot container including 450,000 servings of Breedlove's fortified food blends to the Saint-Marc area. Due to the devastating nature of Hurricane Matthew, 80% of crops have been destroyed and many are without shelter throughout the country. It is expected to take years to rebuild and therefore fundraising efforts for food aid will be ongoing.

The two organizations are driven by the shared mutual goal of feeding the hungry. Operation HOPE began working with the people of Haiti after the 2010 earthquake, and this effort will enable their current in-country connections to make the delivery of Breedlove food aid a possibility. There is great synergy with each organization, linked by a common board member, Brad Bouma.

Brad Bouma, Interim CEO/Board Member for Breedlove and President of the Board for Operation HOPE said, "This is an opportunity to be able to quickly provide life-saving nutrition to families who have lost everything, including their future due to the decimation of their crops. Breedlove has access to the food, and Operation HOPE has the direct contacts in Haiti, so it's the perfect team to quickly and directly provide relief to people who desperately need it. When two dedicated organizations such as Breedlove and Operation HOPE come together with a common goal of feeding the hungry, and the people of this community and country support these efforts, then wonderful, life-changing things happen."
